**Subject:- Grant of Conditional permission to the Maharashtra Arogya Mandal's, Sumatibhai Shah Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Hadapsar, Pune-411028, Maharashtra (AYU0148) for intake capacity with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course and 72 seats in 12 PG Course in the subject namely 1)Agad Tantra-06 seats 2) Ayurveda Samhita and Siddhanta-06 seats 3)Dravyaguna Vigyan-06 seats 4) Kayachikitsa-06 seats 5) Kriya Sharir-06 seats 6) Panchkarma-06 seats 7) Prasuti Tantra and Strirog-06 seats 8) Rasa Shastra and Bhaisajya Kalpana-06 seats 9) Rog Nidan avam Vikriti Vigyan-06 seats 10) Swastharvritta -06 seats 11) Shalya Tantra-06 seats 12) Shalakya Tantra-06 seats and 05 seats in 01 PG Diploma course in the subject namely - 1) Prasuti Tantra and Strirog-05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23 and issuance of Letter of Permission (LoP) to start 01 new PG course in the subject namely Kaumarbhritya (06 seats)under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2022-23-regarding.**

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM ACT 2020 shall not be applicable.

1. I am to refer to your application vide ref.no. **MAM/SS/Ayu/468 dated 12.10.2021**, on the subject cited above and to verify the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff and other facilities available at your college namely **Maharashtra Arogya Mandal's, Sumatibhai Shah Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Hadapsar, Pune-411028, Maharashtra (AYU0148) to start 01 new PG course in the subject namely Kaumarbhritya (06 seats) from the academic session 2022-23**, visitation has been carried out for issuance of Letter of Intent on **06.06.2022 & 08.06.2022 through hybrid mode** by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board (NCISM) and Letter of Intent (LoI) has been issued to your college vide letter of **even no. dated 12.08.2022 to start 01 new PG course in the subject namely Kaumarbhritya (06 seats) under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 from the academic session 2022-23.**
2. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) had carried out an inspection of the college again on **20.10.2022 and 21.10.2022 through Hybrid mode** to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities available as a part of annual visitation **for issuance of conditional permission for intake capacity with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course and 72 seats in 12 PG Course in the subject namely 1) Agad Tantra-06 seats 2) Ayurveda Samhita and Siddhanta-06 seats 3) Dravyaguna Vigyan-06 seats 4) Kayachikitsa-06 seats 5) Kriya Sharir-06 seats 6) Panchkarma-06 seats 7) Prasuti Tantra and Strirog-06 seats 8) Rasa Shastra and Bhaisajya Kalpana-06 seats 9) Rog Nidan avam Vikriti Vigyan-06 seats 10) Swastharvritta -06 seats 11) Shalya Tantra-06 seats 12) Shalakya Tantra-06 seats and 05 seats in 01 PG Diploma course in the subject namely - 1) Prasuti Tantra and Strirog-05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23 and Letter of Permission to start 01 new PG course namely Kaumarbhritya -06 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 from the academic session 2022-23.**
3. Further, in view of above assessment report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely "the Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019", the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for post-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016" provisions under the



NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under, visitor's report and on the basis of Relaxation policy issued by the NCISM dated 16.03.2022.

4. As per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the assessment report was placed in the **21<sup>st</sup> Board Meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **29.11.2022**. Board discussed and decided that the college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for **Grant of Conditional Permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 72 seats in 12 PG Course in the subject namely 1) Agad Tantra-06 seats 2) Ayurveda Samhita and Siddhanta-06 seats 3) Dravyaguna Vigyan-06 seats 4) Kayachikitsa-06 seats 5) Kriya Sharir-06 seats 6) Panchkarma-06 seats 7) Prasuti Tantra and Strirog-06 seats 8) Rasa Shastra and Bhaisajya Kalpana-06 seats 9) Rog Nidan avam Vikriti Vigyan-06 seats 10) Swastharvritta -06 seats 11) Shalya Tantra-06 seats 12) Shalakyia Tantra-06 seats and 05 seats in 01 PG Diploma course in the subject namely – 1) Prasuti Tantra and Strirog-05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23 and issuance of letter of Permission to start 01 new PG course in the subject namely Kaumarbhritya (06 seats) under section 29 of NCISM ACT 2020 from the academic session 2022-23.**
5. Further, in accordance of the regulation 6 (2) (i) (i) of "Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019 vide letter of even no. dated **09.12.2022** letter was sent to the college to furnish fixed security deposit worth **Rupees 50 lakhs** in favor of National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine, in response of the same college has furnished the fixed security deposit in favor of the National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine through **RTGSNo. CNRBR52022121295213745 dated 12.12.2022 of rupees 50 lakh transferred by Canara Bank, Hadaspur, Pune, Maharashtra (for a period of three years).**
6. **Therefore, it has been decided by the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine(NCISM) to issue Conditional Permission for intake capacity with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course and 72 seats in 12 PG Course in the subject namely 1) Agad Tantra-06 seats 2) Ayurveda Samhita and Siddhanta-06 seats 3) Dravyaguna Vigyan-06 seats 4) Kayachikitsa-06 seats 5) Kriya Sharir-06 seats 6) Panchkarma-06 seats 7) Prasuti Tantra and Strirog-06 seats 8) Rasa Shastra and Bhaisajya Kalpana-06 seats 9) Rog Nidan avam Vikriti Vigyan-06 seats 10) Swastharvritta -06 seats 11) Shalya Tantra-06 seats 12) Shalakyia Tantra-06 and 05 seats in 01 PG Diploma course in the subject namely – 1) Prasuti Tantra and Strirog-05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23, to issue Letter of Permission (LOP) to start 01 new PG course in the subject namely Kaumarbhritya (06 seats) under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2022-23 and relevant regulations thereunder and subject to following conditions:**
  - I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
  - II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the **permitted intake capacity of 60 seats and 78 seats in 13 PG courses** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2022-23 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
  - III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
7. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
8. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
9. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2022 and send a compliance report to get permission for the session 2023-24: -**
  - i) all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
  - ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
  - iii) all the requirements of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for Post-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
  - iv) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto; and
10. **The permission to start 01 new PG course in the subject namely Kaumarbhritya (06 seats) from the academic session 2022-23 as stated above for the first admitted batch of 2022-23 session, will be valid till such time as the first batch of students admitted against these courses appear for the first final**



examination of the said courses and at that time, the College authorities may take up the matter for recognition of the qualifications under Section 35 of the NCISM Act,2020.

11. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission from the academic session 2023-24.
